CALL TO ORDER

The SELACO WDB Business Advisory Committee meeting was called to order by Committee Vice Chair Joseph Derthick at 1:41 p.m.

1. Approval of Minutes – January 28, 2016

After review a motion was made, seconded and carried to approve the minutes from the meeting held on January 28, 2016. (Janie Ladao/Joseph Derthick)

2. Discussion and Possible Action: Vision and Mission

SELACO WDB Business Services Director Marjean Clements distributed copies of the following which is an excerpt from the SELACO WDB's 5-Year Plan:

SELACO WDB's vision for meeting workforce development challenges within Southeast Los Angeles County is one centered on collaboration among a wide range of stakeholders' interests, including those of business, labor education, social services, philanthropy and community organizations. Bringing this vision to fruition will require

that stakeholders work together to address the skills development and training needs of priority sectors, while at the same time ensuring that workers have access to career pathway training that meets those needs.

The group reviewed the statement and agreed to simplify it and adapt it as the vision of the Business Advisory Committee. Staff will work with Committee Chair Barbara Levine in minimizing the verbiage of the statement.

The group also discussed the need to increase business participation on the Committee. SELACO WDB Executive Director Yolanda Castro shared that majority of the Board are representatives of businesses. At the next Board meeting, Ms. Castro will encourage Board members to participate on the Business Advisory Committee. Ms. Castro also shared plans to reintroduce and promote SELACO and its services to all the local Chambers of Commerce within the local area with hopes of encouraging membership to both the WDB and the Business Advisory Committee.

The simplified vision statement will be sent out before the next meeting for review and comments by other Committee members.

3. Review of Committee Nomination Form

The group reviewed SELACO WDB's nomination form that is currently distributed to local chambers and city managers and is being used to solicit nominations for the Business Advisory Committee. The group discussed and recommended changes and corrections. The form will be revised to reflect the suggested changes.

It was suggested that a letter be sent out to nominees informing them that they have been nominated to serve on the Business Advisory Committee as well as an information sheet that describes their role/responsibility as a member of the committee.

Nominations are reviewed by the Committee and then forwarded as a recommendation to the WDB for review and final approval.

INFORMATION ITEM(S):

1. Update on Manufacturing White Paper

A copy of the manufacturing 'white paper' was distributed to everyone for review and comment. The Manufacturing Study: A Foundation for Developing Sector Strategies is a compilation of the results of a series of activities held by the SELACO WDB meant to develop a partnership with the manufacturing industry and local educational systems to meet the workforce needs of companies within the community that will stimulate employment and the growth of local businesses.

A final draft of the 'white paper' will go to print mid-May and will be forwarded to the Committee for final review and comment. Copies of the final manufacturing study will be given to members of the Collaborative Community Network (CCN), manufacturing companies

involved in the study, Board members, local Chambers of Commerce, local cities (city council, city manager, economic development), EDD/LMID representative, CWA and SlingShot members.

2. Business Service Board Report Information

Ms. Clements shared business contact information that is currently being reported to the Board on a monthly basis. This information includes:

- o Total number of contacts
- o Type of contact (intake, lay off aversion, ETP, recruitment, etc.)
- Outcomes
- o City where company is located in

3. Recruitment Information

Information on recruitment is also being reported to the Board on a regular basis. This information will show the companies that SELACO has assisted with direct recruitment and the cities these companies are located in.

4. Managed Career Pipeline Pilot Project

SELACO has partnered with Cerritos College, Homeboy Industries, LACOE, SASSFA and Weber Metals to offer an opportunity to participate in classroom training, a career fair, hiring possibilities and an apprenticeship program for a Maintenance Mechanic position in the manufacturing industry.

- 1. Individuals wishing to refer a candidate for membership on the SELACO WDB Business Advisory Committee will complete a SELACO WDB Business Advisory Committee Nomination Form.
- 2. Completed forms are to be faxed or emailed to the attention of SELACO staff listed on the Nomination Form.
- 3. Upon receipt, SELACO staff will include the nomination on the agenda of the next scheduled Committee meeting.
- 4. SELACO staff will send a letter to the candidate informing them that they have been referred for membership on the SELACO WDB Business Advisory Committee.
- 5. The candidate will be invited to the Committee meeting where their nomination will be reviewed and acted upon. This will give them the opportunity to introduce themselves and answer any questions the Committee might have regarding their participation.
- 6. The Committee will review and act upon the nomination presented.
- 7. Nominations not considered for membership will receive explanation of the Committee's decision to reject the nomination.
- 8. Nominations both approved and rejected will be forwarded to the WDB Board for final review, comment and approval.
- 9. Upon WDB approval, the nomination will be forwarded to the Policy Board for their information.
- 10. Approved members will receive a welcome letter and membership orientation will be scheduled.
